# <u>Tracy Historical Museum/West Side Pioneer Association (THM/WSPA)</u> <u>Scholarship Program Description</u>

<u>Two (2) \$500 Scholarships</u>: Graduating Seniors planning to attend a 2 year or 4 year college with a demonstrated interest in Local History

**Application Deadline:** March 31, 2015

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To recognize a Tracy area graduating high school senior who has demonstrated an interest or involvement with the history of the Tracy community. Scholarship funding is support by the very generous bequest of \_\_\_\_\_\_ to the WSPA/Tracy Historical Museum.

#### 2. Eligibility Requirements

- a. Senior on track to graduate in May/June of current school year
- b. Enrolled in public high school located within Tracy Unified High School District Boundaries and lives within TUSD High School District boundaries
- c. Plan to attend accredited 2 year or 4 year college as full time student in Fall following graduation
- d. Demonstrated interest in local Tracy history

#### 3. Application Process - Submission Deadline - March 31, 2015

- a. Complete application packet includes:
  - i. Completed signed application form
  - ii. Copy of school paper, essay or project submitted in required format
- b. Application submission process:
  - i. Mail complete signed application packet to the Museum must be postmarked by submission deadline, **OR** arrange delivery of application packet or project to the Museum during operating hours (note: Museum is open limited hours each week), <u>AND</u>
  - ii. Email history paper or essay in WORD format to tracymuseum@sbcglobal.net

Incomplete or late applications will not be considered. Because the Museum is not open every day, contact the Museum at least a week prior to the deadline for questions or to make special arrangements for submission or project review.

#### 4. Scholarship Award Distribution Guidelines and Conditions of Award

All applicants will be notified in writing of the determinations by the end of the school year. It is the target to announce award recipients before high school awards night ceremonies. Awardees may be required to provide proof of enrollment at an accredited 2 or 4 year college before the scholarship award is issued; in this case, awardees should allow about a month for the award check to be issued upon submission of required verifications. On special request the award distribution may be delayed if enrollment is deferred, but must be used within 1 year from the date of award. The THM/WSPA reserves the right to make awards payable to the applicable college to be credited to the student.

#### 5. Award Selection Criteria

- a. The primary award selection criteria will be based on the demonstrated interest in local Tracy history as evidenced through submission of one or more of the following 3 activities.
  - i. Documentation of volunteer work at Tracy Historical Museum or with THM/WSPA or other local history work document volunteer activities and hours
  - ii. School paper or project on local history submit paper or project
  - iii. Essay on Tracy community history submit essay
- b. If needed to distinguish applicants because of comparable demonstrated interest in local history, the following additional criteria will considered:
  - i. Academic performance, school academic activities, other school activities
  - ii. Community activities

Please refer to Project/Paper/Essay Guidelines on page 3 of the Application Form. The uniqueness and originality of the history documented and the quality of the presentation will be factors in selection. A copy of your paper (or project as applicable) will be placed in the Museum archives and may be reprinted in the Museum Newsletter.

#### PROJECT/PAPER/ESSAY SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Paper or essay must have title, name and date on the first page. Each page must have a footer with the title and page number.
- 2. Paper or essay should be at least 2 pages typed, double spaced (about 750 words), not including copies of pictures or documents if any. There is no maximum length.
- 3. Because this paper/essay will be placed in the Museum archives, documentation of research references or sources is highly recommended
- 4. In addition to providing a hard copy with the application packet, please **EMAIL** the paper/essay in WORD format to <u>tracymuseum@sbcgloabl.net</u> by the application deadline.
- 5. If you are submitting a project, please provide a copy with application packet or arrange delivery to the Museum or other review as applicable by the application deadline. Projects should be labeled with title, name and date. Original projects will be returned after review.

### POSSIBLE LOCAL TRACY HISTORY TOPICS

For projects, papers and essays, any topic of local history may be identified. Following are some ideas, but they are not required to be used or an exhaustive list.

With resources generally available within the Tracy Historical Museum, <u>possible</u> project/paper/essay topics include the following. This is the sample list only. The uniqueness and originality of the history documented and the quality of the presentation will be factors in selection:

- 1. The continuation and new histories of ethnic Tracyites
- 2. Tracy history during the Great Depression
- 3. History of 1920s Tracy Poker City
- 4. History of Tracyites in WWI, WWII, Korean War, Vietnam War, Afghan and Gulf Wars
- 5. History of Tracy Athletes
- 6. History of Tracy during the civil rights and women's movements of the 1960s
- 7. History of Farm Workers in Tracy

- 8. History of Tracy Airport
- 9. History of 1918 Spanish Influenza in Tracy
- 10. History of corporate farming in Tracy
- 11. History of Tracy Schools
- 12. History of Tracy Churches
- 13. Political and City Government History in Tracy
- 14. The Social Impact of railroads on Tracy's History
- 15. The Indigenous Tribal History of Tracy

Using resources primarily outside the Tracy Historical Museum, possible project/paper/essay topics include:

- 1. Personal Family histories
- 2. Oral histories of individual; Tracyites
- 3. Architectural histories of buildings and businesses in Tracy
- 4. History of social and community organizations in Tracy
- 5. History of parks in Tracy
- 6. History of crime in Tracy

- 7. History of Media in Tracy
- 8. History of North Side and South Sides in Tracy
- 9. Racial history in Tracy
- 10. History of women in Tracy
- 11. History of transportation in Tracy
- 12. History of communication in Tracy
- 13. History of residential growth in Tracy
